



Basin View

City of Klamath Falls, Oregon



The proposed Basin View development is planned as a series of neighborhoods settled at the base of the Hogback Mountain overlooking the town of Klamath Falls. By developing compact neighborhoods more than half the site will be left as a continuous network of open space. This network will preserve the majority of the steep face of the Hogback as well as a series of intermittent waterways that fan out through the lower developed areas. The open spaces will provide natural drainage off the mountain, wildlife corridors, recreational pathways, and the overall landscape aesthetic to the new community.

The community will be comprised of seven neighborhoods each with its own center and distinct edges. Neighborhoods vary

in size but are governed by the principle of the five minute walk from center to edge. The neighborhoods are divided by natural corridors, such as steep slopes or drainageways, or transportation corridors of large roads that would disrupt the neighborhoods' residential centers. The neighborhood centers are marked by small public open spaces such as a green or square and a community building.
